Presentation: B) Charles E. Murphy School: Academic Parent Teacher Teams.

Principal Amy Espinoza presented on the five components for school improvement; Leadership, strong teachers, safe orderly environment, curriculum alignment and parent involvement. The goal of the team; that families can work with teachers as genuine partners to maximize student learning. Goal is to engage them in student learning in a deeper way. Students spend 12% of their time at school. Three grade level teams volunteered to pilot a use of conferences to build stronger parent relationships and empower families to make stronger contributions to student achievement. Teachers meet with parents three times per year during the evening as a classroom group. They begin with a team building activity so parents get to know each other and teachers introduce foundation shell students and parents will work on and classroom and student data. Teacher models two activities parents can do to build their shell at home and parents practice the activity and then set individual child goals. First round of meetings have been help. Parent council meetings are very positive. Sandra Berardy requested a follow up report at the end of the year.

Many students were looking to the break, very excited for it but however were dreading the tests the day before the breaks. Examples: Physics, Calc, Pre-Calc, essays for English; BUT really excited for the Holiday season!

Joshua Archibald; The high school Student Government is running a food drive to benefit Montville Social Services, which makes baskets to benefit local families each holiday season.

To incentivize participation, Student Government made the food drive a contest between the graduating classes. Students who bring in food items just place their donations into the shopping cart with their graduation year on it. The four shopping carts were graciously lent to us by Big Y.

The junior class won Part 1 of the food drive, beating the seniors by one can and receiving a donation from Student Government for its efforts. Part 1 concluded last Tuesday to meet Social Services' Thanksgiving deadline; we gathered 306 food items over the course of five school days. Part 2 will end on December 15 in time for the winter holidays.

Item 10. Superintendent's Report.

a. Report from the Director of Student Services – Mrs. Paula LaChance.

This month kept me busy conducting observations in the Transition Program as well as throughout the district. I took a trip to the local Firehouse where the students go on a regular basis to clean the trucks and common areas. They are also volunteering at Social Services on a weekly basis.

Also this month I have worked quite a bit with outside Psychiatrists observing and reviewing records for one of our students. We do have a number of students requiring outside evaluations that I am working on setting up. Many or our previous providers no longer offer school services so I have had to network to collaborate with new providers. Also this month I attended the Title IX Training in New Haven in order to remain in compliance with State guidelines.

Also this month Jen Russell organized a Handle with Care Training for new staff as well as existing staff that needed it. Denise Dunning arranged a presentation from BRS on the Level up Program for our older 16 to 21 Year old special education students. The DORS Level Up Program is all about providing students with the tools, training and resources to work competitively and foster a path to independence.

b. Report from Assistant Superintendent – Mrs. Pallin.

Title I, II, III, and IV Grants: Today we submitted our final federal entitlement grant application. We have received notification that our applications for Title I, II, and III grants have been approved, and we expect to receive information about the Title IV grant shortly. We were not eligible to apply for a bilingual grant as the number of students at Mohegan who speak the same language dropped below the criteria for qualification (20 students speaking the same language) as a bilingual school this year. The entitlement grants enable us to provide limited funding for supplies, afterschool programming, and professional development during our current freeze on much of our spending.

Donors Choose: Our teachers are working hard to seek alternative funding to support their work in the classroom. I urge you to go to donorschoose.org and search for projects near Montville. You will find five Montville projects currently seeking funds, and nine projects which have already been funded this school year. I would like to recognize teachers who have put the time and effort into pursuing funding for materials to supplement their

programs. Mary Aledia, Sharon Brown, Cathy Brush, Genny Christensen, Shannon Craddock, Stacey Girardin, Deb Hamm, Wendy Rohde, and Paula Washburn all have received funding so far this year, and Janella Carroll, Joel Farrior, Robin Greenwald, Stacey Olendorf, and Erin Spurgas have active requests which have received partial funding.

Progress in Adoption of the Readers' Workshop Program: Our trainer has completed her first round of training sessions at the Tyl and the elementary schools. Teachers are already asking about her return in January. Preliminary reports are that our students at all grade levels, K-8, have re-captured the joy of reading which was one of our goals for adoption of this new program. Teachers report that students eagerly "shop" for new books and enjoy the increased one-on-one time as they confer with the teacher about their reading. We will be providing a report on implementation of the program at the December E&E committee meeting.

c. Monthly Update - Superintendent Levesque.

I would like to applaud Laurie for her efforts around Readers Workshop- Laurie was determined to make this happen and worked diligently all summer long to make it a reality. You should stop into the Elementary schools to take a look at the results of her hard work. Laurie, Kathy and I attended the Finance meeting earlier this evening. Less than a week ago we thought we knew what our funding was and had a plan in place – I received a call from our State Representative last Friday afternoon indicating that the Governor made a budget announcement which includes additional cuts to Montville in the amount of 1.6 million dollars and which they are calling it a hold back. In theory if the money becomes available they may release those funds to us. State Legislature will meet again in December to address the growing deficit. If we are forced to make these cuts (1.6 Million) by the end of December 39% of the school year would have been completed and staffing cuts would require an additional 40 % cut to reach the number and would be cutting well into the \$2 million dollar range and would include services, programs and staff. This is a complicated matter and will take everyone working together in order to do what is best for the Town of Montville.

I have many different scenarios which I am working to address the possible cuts and this is a very difficult challenge that we are facing. In theory the funds cut this year will be reinstated in next year's budget. With the deficit the State is talking about currently I do not feel confident that this will be the case.

Item 11. Information items. Monica Pomazon reported that the CABE conference was very informative. A lot of information on policy was shared and it was beneficial.

Sandra spoke about the workshops and reminded the board not to respond to parents on Facebook- and not to use personal computers or phones for board business. Do not engage on Facebook- don't check personal email on Board devices with board email addresses.
