Item 2: Confidential Hearing Related to Confidential Student Matter.

The Board entered executive session at 5:03 p.m. During the executive session, the Board held a student disciplinary hearing and, after excusing all but the Board's counsel, deliberated on the matter.

The Board then came out of executive session at 6:45 p.m. and made the following motion:

Motion:

That the Board of Education finds that the student who is the subject of this hearing did, on October 27, 2010, violate a publicized policy of the Board of Education, seriously disrupt the educational process and endanger persons, by her actions in assaulting a fellow student and a staff member on school property.

The administration informs parents and students of the Board's policies concerning behavior through publishing the Board's policies in the student handbook and by going over the handbook with students.

On the basis of the foregoing conduct, the Board of Education expels the student who is the subject of this hearing, from all school property and all school-sponsored activities for one calendar year, effective immediately and continuing through October 27, 2011. During the period of expulsion, the student is not permitted on school property or at any school-sponsored activities, unless written permission is obtained in advance from the administration.

During the period of expulsion, the administration shall provide the student with an alternative educational opportunity, as determined by the administration.
