8. REPORTS

- A. ACCOUNT BALANCES: Checking account balance is \$48,098.96. STIF account balance is \$362,806.26 and Citizens Money Market account balance is \$18,887.93, bringing total cash reserve to \$381,694.19.
- <u>B. OCCUPANCY:</u> Double occupancy apartments 14 and 69 are still vacant. We do not have any double occupancy applications at present.
- <u>C. TENANT PROBLEMS:</u> ED reported that the tenants in apartment 22 are complaining about the noise from the air-conditioner and oxygen machine in apartment 24. She is in the process of trying to find out if there is excessive noise.
- D. FINAL PHASE, FV WINDOW REPLACEMENT: This item is on the agenda.
- <u>E. IV GENERATOR PAD PROGRESS:</u> ED reported that there has been no new information regarding the arrival of the generator from Mohegan Fire Company. She is hoping to get some information this week.
- <u>F. ROAD AND PARKING LOT PAINTING:</u> ED reported that the maintenance man has painted new signs on the street and parking areas at Independence Village.
- <u>G. ACCESS (WRAP) PROGRESS:</u> ED reported that she had a meeting with two representatives from ACCESS regarding the energy audit to be scheduled. The maintenance person accompanied them on an inspection of some of the units. Some of the items that were discussed as probable improvements were heat pumps for both heating and cooling each unit, new windows were necessary, new refrigerators, new exterior and interior light fixtures, bathroom and kitchen exhaust fans, and ceiling insulation.
- <u>H. QUARTERLY REPORT:</u> ED stated she had not placed this item on the Agenda ahead of time because she did not know if she would have time to complete it. The Commissioners reviewed the quarterly report for the period ending June 30, 2011.
- I. ANNUAL REPORT TO COMMISSIONERS: ED stated she had not placed this item on the agenda ahead of time in case she was not able to produce it. She distributed the report to the Commissioners.

9. OLD BUSINESS

A. AWARD WINDOW REPLACEMENT BID

ED informed the Commissioners that only two bids were submitted. The third interested bidder notified her at the very last minute that he was not going to submit a bid because he would not be able to complete the job in the specified time frame. Irving Small's bid was for \$6,480.00 and John Lathrop Construction's bid was for \$6,000.00. Both contractors are equally qualified for the job. MOTION by Commissioner Thomes, seconded by Commissioner Roemmele to award the job to John Lathrop Construction for \$6,0000.00. Voice vote. All in favor. MOTION CARRIED.

10. NEW BUSINESS

A. AUTHORIZE INSTALLATION OF SNOW PARK AND ADDED PARKING, IV

ED reported she did not have an estimate from the Snow Removal company for the snow park or the additional parking at this time. MOTION by Commissioner Fecher, seconded by Commissioner Roemmele to table this item until the September meeting. Voice vote. All in favor. MOTION CARRIED.

B. INSTALL NEW ROOF ON BUILDING 3, FV

ED reported that the roof on building 3 at FV had been installed quite some time before the rest of the roofs at FV were re-shingled with architectural shingles thus it is in poor condition. Since it is too hot to shingle right now, she is requesting that the item be tabled until the September meeting. So moved by Commissioner Fecher, seconded by Commissioner Roemmele. Voice vote. All in favor. MOTION CARRIED.

11. REMARKS FROM PUBLIC: No remarks.

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12. REMARKS FROM COMMISSIONERS

ED reported that the 2009 and 2010 audit will be conducted next week. It is scheduled for July 26 & 27. She also gave the Commissioners a report on the legislative action dealing with housing issues in this years session.
