#### 2015-16 Board of Education Goals:

To engage in a cycle of continuous improvement to ensure all students are educated with high standards and achieve at the highest levels of learning in the Montville Public Schools.

#### **COMMITTEE ASSIGNMENTS**

Chair B. Mitchell appointed new Board members Colleen Rix and Daniel Boisvert to the Educational Evaluation Committee due to openings from the recent Town election. The appointments for liaisons to various committees will be done at the December Board meeting.

## Presentation: A) Montville Marvels.

## Presentation: B) Charles E. Murphy School: Creating a Culture of Learners.

Principal Amy Espinoza gave a PowerPoint presentation on Creating a Culture of Learners, a program at the Murphy School to motivate students. The idea for the program got started in Professional Development in the 2014-2015 school year and utilizes feedback, movement/brain and learning, classroom lessons and parent education. Students are introduced to a question--"What is your grit level?"--that relates to a student's ability to work hard on a Grit Scale. Level 3 or 4 are the grit level goals with improved motivation and attention on focus needs to attain that level. Another aspect of the program is the No Opt-out Policy whereby a student's response would be "I don't know yet." The 2015-2016 goals for the program include Striving for Mindset or mindfulness—getting students centered before learning and to create a culture of problem solvers. In response to a question by Board member C. Baxter, Principal Espinoza said home/parent integration is done through newsletter and PTC's.

- 2. Montville Carolers will be starting their performances around southeastern Connecticut next month and their schedule can be found on the MHS music website under choirs.
- 3. Marching band will conclude their very successful season at this Friday's senior night football game and on December 6<sup>th</sup> at the Holiday Parade.

- 4. Last Saturday, the MHS robotics team traveled to South Windsor and participated in the first statewide competition of year. The next event is on December 5<sup>th</sup> in Monroe, CT.
- 5. The Yes Club is currently in the middle of a food drive and is collecting nonperishable food items.
- 6. The Montville Arts Council attended a poetry reading in Manchester where poets read their favorite or original work.
- 7. Last month, students from ECE American Experience and American Studies classes visited the Whitney Museum of Art in New York City.

d. Consideration and action to appoint a delegate to the CABE Delegate Assembly, Thursday, November 19, 2015, 3:00 – 6:00 p.m., Mystic Marriott, Groton.

Chair B. Mitchell stated that he would be parliamentarian for the CABE event. A delegate was not appointed but B. Mitchell said that one could be right up until the date of the event.

e. Discussion of progress of the Community Service Study Committee.

Assistant Superintendent L. Pallin reported that Board member T. Pomazon, student representatives, and parents participated in two meetings regarding the Board's goal of community service for students as a graduation requirement. At the meetings, expectations already at the high school were looked at as well as the view taken by other schools on the topic. The Committee identified community service as not being a job but instead as unpaid time spent outside of home and family on a voluntary basis that denounces the Board's goal as a graduation requirement. L. Pallin stated that the Committee also considered how to incentivize community service as being helpful and rewarding; to rally the entire school

with input from students who already volunteer; to create a student survey all of which to build well-rounded leaders with connections to community. Board member T. Pomazon commented on the same.

g. Consideration and action to request that the Montville Town council deposit into a dedicated, non-lapsing account, the unexpended educational appropriation for fiscal year 2014-2015 as determined by the auditor's report for the fiscal year, which ended June 20, 2015. This amount will not exceed 1% of the total budgeted appropriation for fiscal year 2014-15, as allowed under CT State Statute Sec. 10-248a.

Superintendent Levesque reported that the final audit figures for 2014-2015 are expected prior to the next Board meeting so that a letter can be sent to the Town Council regarding use of the funds by the Board for unanticipated expenses. The anticipated amount, \$236,000, would not exceed 1% of the current operating budget and is attributed to retirees who gave notice after January. As to the current operating budget, special education costs are expected to be high due to large number of students entering the district that require the services.

# L. Pallin reported to the Board on the following:

- Next Generation Science Standards: The state is gearing up to develop programs and provide training now that the State Board of Education has approved the new science standards. I recently worked with the State to review grant applications to develop professional learning programs and will attend a meeting next Monday to iron out the details of the roll out of the standards and related testing. At all grade levels and in all content areas, the standards call for an increase in evidence-based reasoning, using models and experimentation to build understanding, and developing and interpreting arguments. These key shifts are directly aligned to our district-wide problem solving work which means that adapting to the new standards will allow us to continue our focus on one goal.
- <u>SAT</u>: The administration of the SAT for the purpose of State accountability testing will take place during the school day on March 2<sup>nd</sup>. We are in the process of providing the College Board with the information needed in preparation for this testing.
- <u>Project O</u>: Interim co-directors have been hired and the Delegate Assembly will meet right after Thanksgiving to being the search for a permanent director. We are very pleased with the initial work of the interim co-directors.
- <u>Teacher Evaluation</u>: The State Department of Education has identified Montville's Teacher Evaluation Plan as a model plan, and we continue to get requests from districts to share the plan; just this month I have forwarded our plan to two other districts who are in the process of revising their plans.

- <u>Transportation Department</u>: Our interim coordinator continues to do an excellent job of filling in for us. We conducted five (5) interviews last week for the permanent coordinator. We hope to have someone hired in the next couple of weeks.

- <u>CABE/CAPSS Conference</u>: I look forward to seeing everyone at the conference this weekend. It looks like it will be a great conference again this year.
