Town Council Chairman McNally read into the record the notice for the Town of Montville Budget Hearing for the Board of Education FY 2022-2023 and asked if anyone wished to speak on behalf of the budget.

Superintendent of Schools Pallin spoke in support of the Board of Education FY 2022-2023 Operating Budget of \$41,729,949, a 4.81% increase from the prior fiscal year. The proposed budget contains no new programs, initiatives or improvement but is necessary to maintain current programs. The BOE budget and its increase was presented as follows:

- An increase of 41.36% for special education outplacements as result of eight (8) students who entered the district after development of the FY2022 budget creating a deficit and unexpected expense estimated at \$560,000 to be drawn from the 2% account to meet costs.
- An increase of 28.42% for wages to accommodate contractual increases and a negotiated COLA increase of 0.5% 2.0% for FY2023 currently at 5.9%.
- The addition of two (2) behaviorists and increased monitor hours for student safety and special education and use of the ARP ESSER grants for increases in tutors, paraprofessionals, safety officers, and monitors, positions that can be phased out upon expiration of the grant.
- An increase of 21.1% for benefits--health insurance at a 10% increase over FY2022 and MERS pension costs for the BOE currently 16.44% to 18.26% for FY2023.
- An increase of 5% for cost of supplies—gas from a current locked rate of \$1.79 per gallon to FY2023 rates of \$3.50 and \$3.00 for gas and diesel, respectively; and fuel oil currently locked at \$1.89 per gallon budgeted for \$2.95 per gallon for next year. Budget supplies have been level-funded and will be reduced to stay within budget given inflation now at 8.5%.

Examples of one-time savings cuts in prior budget years used to offset cost increases were referenced. The proposed FY2023 budget was thoroughly reviewed and scrutinized for additional cuts by Superintendent Pallin and Business Manager Kathy Lamoureux but were none were found given the stable student enrollment. Appreciation was extended to Mayor McDaniel and the Town Council in consideration of the FY 2023 budget.

Town Council Chairman McNally asked three (3) times if there was anyone from the public who wished to speak on the Public Hearing. There were no other comments.

5. Adjournment

Motion by Councilor Mandler; seconded by Councilor May to adjourn the meeting at 6:07 p.m. Discussion: none. Voice vote: 5-0, all in favor. Meeting adjourned.
