First Budget Run-Costs based on contracted raises, quotes for supplies and services, enrollment projections, and IEP obligations. Maintaining Current Services and Meeting IEP Requirements - \$43,274,100. Total Budget Request \$43,799,600, Percent increase over last year's budget 6.41%, Percent Increase over appropriation, not including \$200,000 from town ARPA 6.93%.
