Homemaker Program

Meet: Holly Alligood

Come along with me to the art room! I want you to meet Something important is going on in here. It's someone. Wednesday morning March 12 and the seniors in this class are busy working on their paintings. This is the acrylics painting class. The teacher, Holly Alligood, looks at each art work in progress and makes suggestions where needed. This class is all about choices and going at your own pace. There is no tension in this room. A peace and contentment fills the



space. No stress. Each student is working on a painting of their own choice. I see country sides unfolding on canvas, red barns, the rocky coast of Maine coming alive. Over here is a painting bursting with bright colors and full of energy. I am drawn into the scene and don't want to leave. Who is Holly and what is the story behind this soft spoken art teacher? "I love what I do here in my art classes! I teach acrylics painting and drawing classes at the Center. My happiest moments are when I make a simple critique and their faces

at the Center. My happiest moments are when I make a simple critique and their faces light up. They are gaining confidence in themselves as they create in class. " "I was born in San Diego, California but raised here in Connecticut. My dad was in the

Navy and stationed here. We moved into a house in the Oakdale section of town when I was a young child and I went to elementary school at the Oakdale School. " "We moved to Waterford. It was at the Clark Lane Middle School that I found my

love for arts. When Science, History or English needed a drawing or painting, I would be immersed in the project." "I met my husband at the Waterford High and we were married my senior year

when I was seventeen years old. I am still with the same wonderful man after 52 years of marriage, two daughters and five young grandchildren! In those younger years we really had to work to make ends meet and going to art school was out of reach. I was fortunate to get an apprenticeship job as a Dental Ceramist! I absolutely loved what I did which was creating exact crown and bridge work. I did this for 14 years. I totally enjoyed the creative work and

helping people." Holly put herself through art school at the Lyme Art Association, Lyme Academy and the Lyman Allyn Museum. She had private art teachers for years. She has exhibited her art works at the Lyme Association, Mystic and New London.

I have worked in pastel, oil, ink and acrylics. Making greeting cards is one of my favorite things.

Holly also worked for many years at the Salem Town Hall as assistant Town Clerk. "I finally retired from that job and when the opening came up at the Montville Senior Center I applied for the art teacher position. I thought to myself, perhaps I can give back to others some joy and teach them to draw and paint and tell their own stories with their

art." "One thing I have learned in life is be patient with yourself. Everyone is unique and art is doable. Give it a try and enjoy!" Above all that I know is "God is the Greatest ARTIST!"

The beautiful paintings and pencil drawings that are coming to life in the Center's art room will be on exhibit at the annual art show in the Spring. Now you too can see these works of art, meet the artists and Holly herself. See you there!

SENIOR CENTER MEMBERSHIP NEWS

The Montville Senior Center and the Montville Senior Club are now one entity. To make things much less complicated and more efficient, there is only one membership—the Montville SENIOR CENTER MEMBERSHIP. The annual membership dues are \$25.00. (I am certainly able to work with any senior that cannot afford the membership dues, please come see me—we can absolutely work this out in the privacy of my office) Though most folks have not had any issues, few have made indirect comments so I wanted to remind everyone that Montville is one of the only centers in our area and very few throughout our state that does not charge for any of our classes and most programs. I spend a great deal of time writing grants and my dedicated staff and volunteers work very hard on all of our fundraisers so that we can offer these programs for free. The dinners that we have and our lunch program are fundraisers so that all of our seniors can participate in the programs without concern of being able to afford them. For a quick breakdown of the cost:

\$25.00 year = \$2.08 a month = \$0.48 a week = \$0.06 a day

Instructors for <u>one month</u> range between = $\frac{\sqrt{5}}{200-\$1,000}$ (per classes or programs) we presently offer over 30 programs (and can participate in all or some or none) seniors can also come down for coffee & pastry every morning (no additional charge), lunch daily (\$1.00 donation request to help us off set items needed), socialization, health programs, computer use, library & more. Please feel free to contact me if the membership fee poses a hardship and I will always make sure to help. Also feel free to contact me with any questions contact me with any questions.
