#### 2015-16 Board of Education Goals:

To engage in a cycle of continuous improvement to ensure all students are educated with high standards and achieve at the highest levels of learning in the Montville Public Schools.

#### Item 1. Call to order.

Chair Robert Mitchell called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. in the Montville High School Library/Media Center. Per discussion prior to the vote, Superintendent B. Levesque introduced Interim Director of Special Services Kathie Shaughnessy who started in the position after January 1. Interviews for the position will begin Wednesday, February 3 beginning at 4:00 p.m. Thus far, fourteen applicants have responded to the posting that will close effective January 22<sup>nd</sup>.

Levesque added that the biggest change was inclusion of suspension and expulsion measures for pre-Kindergarten -- grade 2; the policy for grades 3 – grade 12 would remain the same.

Per discussion prior to the vote, Board member J. Wood stated that the policy refers to said activity on school grounds. Superintendent B. Levesque added that the issue was not listed in community and district policy. The policy prohibits e-cigarettes, but the use of nicotine patches is allowed.

Per discussion prior to the vote, Board member J. Wood stated the policy was a "tough, serious" issue. Superintendent B. Levesque added that the policy now aligns with state statutes and includes reference to a Rapid Response Team in which the Superintendent must be a member along with others. The policy also includes required, codified reporting that is subject to penalties for failure to report an incident or willfully preventing the writing of a report, both of which are felonies. Board member C. Baxter asked about training for staff. Superintendent Levesque replied that the district trains all staff including bus drivers. Further, he said that future training will be done electronically through DCF beginning July 1, 2016, and must be done annually. Direction for the training is pending from DCF.

Per discussion prior to the vote, Board member J. Wood again stated that this policy was another serious one as the aim is to protect students at risk as well as other students in the classroom. Again, reporting is a component of the policy. Superintendent B. Levesque added that the policy aligns with district policy, Handle with Care that promotes deescalation with restraint as a last resort in compliance with state statutes. The policy also outlines restraint and how it should be used.

#### Item 9. Committee and liaison reports.

- a. Policy (James Wood).
- J. Wood reported that the Committee met earlier this evening and reviewed three policies for which no changes were made. The policies, Policy #5141.4, Child Abuse and Suicide Prevention; Policy #4111, Recruitment and Selection, and Policy #4111.40, Selection Procedures for School Principals, will be brought to the full Board for approval at its next meeting.

### b. Educational Evaluation (Carrie Baxter).

C. Baxter reported that the Committee met earlier this evening where Assistant Superintendent L. Pallin oriented the new Committee members about the Committee goals

and procedures. She also mentioned the March  $2^{nd}$  assessment schedule for the SAT at the high school and the March – May schedule for the SBAC and CMT. Students are tested weekly for SBAC and CMT content matter and it has realized better student responses. C. Baxter indicated that one topic was put on hold for the next meeting.

### c. Montville Education Foundation (Kim Navetta).

K. Navetta said that she was not able to attend the Foundation meeting. Superintendent Levesque reported on a comedy/hypnotist fundraiser that will be held in February at the Montville Polish Club. He said that tickets are \$50 and that more information on the event will be included in his Friday weekly summary. Superintendent Levesque also said that the meeting was also spent stuffing envelopes for the Foundation's annual appeal.

### d. LEARN (Colleen Rix).

C. Rix reported that she attended her first LEARN meeting last Thursday, January 14<sup>th</sup>. The president and vice-president of the Chamber of Commerce spoke and asked whether the regional calendar could be changed in order to promote tourism. C. Rix also said the meeting included an orientation as half of the attendees were new members. Another topic was transportation, some of which is outsourced.

#### e. CABE/NSBA (Robert Mitchell).

B. Mitchell reminded the Board of the NSBA Conference that will be held in Boston on April 9, 10, and 11. He said that registration is still open although early registration rates have passed. B. Mitchell also reported that the CABE Day on the Hill is March 2<sup>nd</sup> and due to SATs on that date, student attendance at the event will be impacted. This weekend he will attend the NSBA lobby effort at a conference in Washington, DC.

#### f. School Building Committee (Todd Pomazon).

T. Pomazon reported that Business Manager K. Lamoureux has had contact with a new State person, but there is nothing new to report on the State audit of the district's school renovation project.

### g. Atlantic Broadband (Todd Pomazon).

T. Pomazon reported that the Advisory Council of Atlantic Broadband will meet tomorrow, January 20 at 5:30 p.m.

### h. Montville Youth Services Bureau (Robert Mitchell).

B. Mitchell said that he was giving his final report for the Bureau. (Earlier this evening, the Board voted Daniel Boisvert as the new Bureau liaison.) He reported that there was no meeting this month and that the next meeting will be the second Thursday in March on the  $10^{\rm th}$ .

# i. Administrative Monthly Reports.

C. Baxter thanked the administrators for their reports stating that she enjoyed the information on the professional development. She said that she was glad to know that the teachers are learning along with their students.

### j. Chair's Remarks.

Chair B. Mitchell welcomed back Sandra Berardy to the Board. She takes the place of Valerie Smith who resigned from the Board at last month's meeting.

### Item 10. Superintendent's Report.

### a. Report from the Interim Director of Student Services – Mrs. Shaughnessy.

K. Shaughnessy stated that it was the end of her second week in the district and reported to the Board on the following:

- Records: I am in the process of reviewing special education confidential records and will be making recommendations. The possibility of electronic records is being explored.
- <u>Contracted Services</u>: I am reviewing contracted services in terms of cost effectiveness and benefits. This review includes meeting with the staff that utilizes these services and determining current needs.
- <u>Summer Programs</u>: We have begun the planning for Extended School Year Services. This year's summer break is almost twelve weeks long due to the planned June 8<sup>th</sup> last day and the August 31<sup>st</sup> start date. Snow days may shorten this period but not significantly.

### Report from Assistant Superintendent - Mrs. Pallin.

# L. Pallin reported to the Board on the following:

• From Fund for Teachers: With 10 Fund for Teachers proposals already underway from Montville teachers, Montville is in the lead for most numbers of proposals submitted by a district in CT. Congratulations! We hope you can keep the momentum growing! Below are the Montville teachers who are working on FFT proposals. It's still not too late for other teachers to apply; proposals are due at the end of January.

- From the College Board: 425 school districts in the U.S. and Canada were names to the 6<sup>th</sup> Annual A.P. Honor Roll for simultaneously achieving increases in access to Advanced Placement® courses for a broader number of students and also improving the rate at which their AP students earned scores of 3 or higher on an AP Exam. This is the second year in a row Montville High School has been recognized. It is one of 16 high schools in the state to achieve this recognition.
- Eureka Math: We hosted a team of teachers and instructional leaders from Coventry Public Schools today to observe our Eureka math program and to meet with our math coach. Our teachers graciously opened their classrooms and met in small groups with teachers to share their insights about adoption of the program. While we know it will be a multi-year process to build our students' skills in mathematical reasoning and modeling, I remain extremely impressed by the depth of true understanding displayed by students in classes I observe.

## b. Monthly Update.

# B. Levesque reported on the following:

• <u>EPA Grants</u>: Application has been made for EPA grants to replace existing school buses within the district at a discounted rate of 25 percent. The plan is to replace three regular, full-size buses at a cost of \$55,000 and one wheelchair accessible but

for \$15,000. He noted that the Town Council denied last week the district's request for a 1% Fund to pay for these buses that were included in the district's capital plan last year. He stated that the district's bus fleet needs to be operable and safe.

• <u>Budget</u>: The Board will hold its annual budget meeting on February 9<sup>th</sup> to discuss the 2016-2017 budget. He has been meeting with principals for the same. He attended district management council meeting which spoke on the task of shifting responsibilities in difficult times to save money and support learning. He met with Town Council Liaison on this topic. He thanked the principals for their conversations to date.
