Janet Kelly explained this was the Math textbook series currently being used by grades 4 and 5 and that grade 4 and 5 teachers liked the book. Laurie Pallin reported that the current textbook in grade 3 – Everyday Math – does not correlate with grade 3 CMTs and is not rigorous enough.
