MEETING MINUTES

1. CALL TO ORDER

It's Chairman called the meeting to order at 4:58 PM in the community center of Freedom Village in Oakdale.

2. ROLL CALL

Present at the meeting were Commissioners Sullivan, Szarzynski, Brower, and Macher. Commissioner Roemmele was absent with cause. Also present was the E.D., Jimmy Majewski from La Framboise Well Drilling, and several residents of Freedom and Independence Village.

3. REMARKS FROM TENANTS

One resident inquired about the ongoing issue of not having enough recycling buckets at Freedom. The ED explained that she had been calling repeatedly for more buckets to be delivered and there was little choice but to keep contacting them and wait for the delivery of the buckets.

One resident asked for an update on the rules and regulations book. The chairman explained that was on the agenda for that night and was in the works. The ED assured the residents that once it was updated all current residents would receive the new book.

One resident revisited the request for a community yard sale. 9. OLD BUSINESS

A. Freedom Well progress with Jimmy Majewski

Jimmy Majewski from La Framboise Drilling explained that the well site has been approved by the state and they were waiting for the go ahead to begin drilling. After the drilling the water will need to be tested and a final approval is needed from the state. He estimated we could be anywhere between 6-12 months from having the well drilled and approved.

A. Power Washing quotes for both properties

The ED explained that she had pursued three bids for power washing both properties. Pollard powerwashing was unable to provide outside water and Eco Systems in Westbrook did not return the call after the bid request. Northeast Powerwashing did provide a bid of \$2725.00 for each property. Commissioner Macher motioned, seconded by Commissioner Brower, to contact Northeast Powerwashing for cleaning both properties. Voice vote, All in favor. MOTION PASSED.

B. Updating Rules and Regulations booklet

The commissioners all provided a mark up of prospective changes to the rules and regulations booklet. The issue has been tabled until June so the ED can condense all the changes for review.

C. Commissioner Contact Information

The Commissioners decided to provide some contact information for posting at the community centers. Commissioners Macher and Szarzynski provided email addresses and Commissioners Brower and Sullivan provided their email and phone numbers.

D. HVAC cleaning plans for 2017

ED indicated that the HVAC units needed a yearly tune up. In the past McCarthy has been used to do this but the commissioners requested the ED take the project out to bid. The issue is tabled until June.
