Dear Members of the Commission:

This office represents the City of New London and the City of New London Water and Water Pollution Control Authority (“WWPCA”). This letter is in opposition to the application submitted by Deer Run Stable, LLC.

Underground storage tanks are prohibited in the watershed area as indicated in the Montville Zoning bylaws. This property is located on the edge of the New London watershed area bordered by Route 85. In order for the project to be accepted by the New London WWPCA, it must be proven by the developer that this property does not contribute to the New London watershed area both from a groundwater and surface water perspective, as this could significantly affect water quality.


Lake Konomoc is the City’s main water supply and would be negatively impacted by a fuel spill and uncontrolled runoff. The water supply serves 60,000 people and contamination would be an environmental disaster.

In the event that this application is approved, it is requested that special precautions must be taken to avoid any contamination. For example, double-walled tanks encased in concrete retaining units with written guarantees of quarterly testing. The testing of the tanks is of great concern to the City of New London as they age. The City would also request that a time frame for replacement be made part of any approvals. In addition, the applicant should be required to immediately notify the City of New London in the event of any possible release of contaminants.

In addition to protection from a potential fuel spill, additional precautions must be taken regarding stormwater runoff and regarding treatment of site runoff. Based on the potential for contamination to the watershed, significant increased stormwater retention and treatment should be considered for this site. It is requested that the proposed permanent maintenance schedule be revised to required a more stringent cleaning and inspection protocol. For example, the property should be swept and cleaned more than twice a year. The catch basin sumps and the oil water separators should be inspected a least quarterly, not twice yearly. Furthermore, the owners should be required to provide timely reports to the Town and to the City of New London WWPCA regarding the results of these inspections.

We appreciate Montville's continued effort to protect the New London Watershed.

I hope you are doing well and staying safe.


I fully support this project as we need something in this area that facilitates the basic needs of the residents of this town. Regarding the concerns of an underground leakage, new technology has been established preventing any leakage from taking place. I have seen gas stations located in aquaflood zones, such as the recent Costco building in Niantic. Due to the electron line leak detectors, gas is unable to leak through those tanks. Compared to Costco this project is in a safer location.

Back in the 1980's the insulation for the tanks were poorly supervised. MTBE and Benzene gas were used to contaminate the water. However today, the change to Ethanol gas has made the environment safer. Moreover double Fiberglass tanks have become a requirement for gasoline stations by DEP. These tanks are good for 40 years and will be placed very far from the wetland and diesel island on the location.

I would really appreciate it if you would approve this site. It will bring a great change in our community. Thank you!
