Comments will only be accepted at times designated for public comment by the Chair of the meeting. The Economic Development Rules of Procedure, decorum, timeliness and suitability shall be followed and enforced in the same manner as if the meeting were held in person.

- Call to Order Chairman Hewitt called the meeting to order at 7:01 p.m.
- 2) Pledge of Allegiance All stood and pledged the flag.
- 3) Roll Call

Present were Commissioners Mickey Gillette, Sheelagh Lapinski, Christopher Napierski, and Chairman Walter Hewitt. Absent were Commissioner Heather Harris, Town Planner Marcia Vlaun (due to technical difficulties) and Town Council Liaison Colleen Rix. A quorum was present.

- 5) Remarks from Marcia Vlaun -- None
- 6) Remarks from the Public regarding items on the Agenda (3-minute limit) Chairman Hewitt asked three (3) times for remarks. There were none.
- 7) Desire to recruit Commissioners.

Chairman Hewitt said there had been no success yet with recruiting new commissioners. Commissioner Lapinski asked about the number of vacancies; there are two (2). Commissioner Napierski asked whether former commissioner K. Butzgy had been approached to rejoin. Chairman Hewitt asked to let him know of anyone who had interest in joining.

8) To Consider and Act on a Motion to approve:

i) The Minutes of the Regular Meeting of November 16, 2020.

Motion by Commissioner Gillette; seconded by Commissioner Lapinski to approve the Regular Meeting Minutes of November 16, 2020. Discussion: none. Voice vote: 4-0, all in favor. Motion carried.

9) Unfinished Business

a) Montville real-estate properties for development

Commissioner Lapinski said she liked the idea about soliciting stores to the Montville Commons discussed at a previous meeting. She said she visited the Commons and said it did not look like the weekend before Christmas because of the many empty stores. Commissioner Napierski said he visited the Commons and Mohegan Sun and had similar comments. Commissioner Lapinski reported that Foxwoods was closing the Rainmaker and the Fox Tower and said she went there a week ago and no one was there. She also said Mohegan employees were now working four (4) days a week and there were no buses now and then asked again if stores should be solicited to the Commons. Commissioner Gillette said the Commons rental spaces were priced well above economy and there was no success 1 ½ years ago regarding the same. Commissioner Napierski also responded that \$35 per square foot was double the normal price. He also asked about the status of the data center. Chairman Hewitt said Town Planner

Vlaun had reported at a previous meeting there were issues with funding. Commissioner Lapinski asked whether Roc-Ten was torn down to avoid paying taxes.

b) New Business Report

Chairman Hewitt commented on the two (2) new businesses on the report—a sales and a consulting/wedding service. He noted there have consistently been 2-3 businesses. Commissioner Napierski also noted the number of businesses in the worsening economic situation. Chairman Hewitt acknowledged the businesses were basically home-based.

Chairman Hewitt said this item was presently in limbo.

d) Chamber Business After Hours – Heather Chairman Hewitt said this item was presently in limbo.
